Boys – Back in Victorian times boys would wear white shirts without a tie and with long black/grey trousers or black/grey shorts. Their socks would be high on their leg and they would wear black shoes or ankle boots. Boys would wear a waistcoat (as plain as possible). Some boys would wear a cap or even a bowler type hat to school but they were certainly not allowed to wear them inside a Victorian school.

Girls – Back in Victorian times girls would wear pinafores/aprons with black shoes. They could wear a bonnet. Alternatively, they could wear a dress that is in a dull colour.

Girls are very welcome to wear the clothes that the boys are wearing as indicated in the photos above.
